

CHAPTER 302.

AN ACT to refund to Joel B. Danner and David Zeigler, partners trading under the name and firm of Danner and Zeigler, the sum of one hundred and twenty dollars, money erroneously paid into the Treasury.

WHEREAS, Joel B. Danner and David Zeigler, partners trading under the name and firm of Danner and Zeigler, having erroneously paid into the Treasury of the State of Maryland the sum of one hundred and twenty dollars, under the provisions of an act of the General Assembly of Maryland, passed at the January session, eighteen hundred and sixty-seven, chapter ninety-eight, entitled "an act to prevent the selling or peddling of carriages, hacks, gigs and buggy-wagons, &c., in Washington county, not manufactured in the State of Maryland," declared unconstitutional, and the same has been repealed by the General Assembly of Maryland; therefore—

Preamble

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That the State Treasurer, upon the warrant of the Comptroller, be and he is hereby authorized and directed to pay to Joel B. Danner and David Zeigler, partners trading under the name and firm of Danner and Zeigler, the sum of one hundred and twenty dollars for moneys erroneously paid by them into the Treasury.

SEC. 2. *And be it enacted,* That this act shall take effect from the date of its passage.
