stored in any elevator, or place of storage connected therewith, in this State, and known in trade as "elevator receipts," shall henceforth for all purposes of sale or other disposition whatsoever, be held to invest and imply title to such grain in the persons to whom or to whose order such receipts shall have been issued, and to vest and imply absolute title in all subsequent holders to whom such receipts shall have been passed by or under any contract or transfer, valid and bona fide as between the parties thereto.

Repealed

SEC. 2. And be it enacted, That all laws or parts of laws, if any, conflicting with the provisions of this act, be and the same are hereby repealed.

In force.

SEC. 3. And be it enacted, That this act shall take effect from and immediately after the date of its passage.

## CHAPTER 305.

AN ACT to appropriate a sum of money, to pay the claims of Ruth P. Griffith and Susannah Bond, of Baltimore city, and Lydia Smith, of Harford county.

Issue warrants to pay

Section 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the Comptroller be and he is hereby authorized and directed, to issue his warrants upon the Treasurer, to pay to Ruth P. Griffith, widow of Howard Griffith Jr., and Susannah Bond, widow of Lambert W. Bond, of Baltimore city, and Lydia Smith, widow of John Smith, of Harford county, soldiers of the war of eighteen hundred and twelve, the sum of three hundred and twenty dollars each, which they have been deprived of in consequence of a clerical error in omitting their names in the pension list of eighteen hundred and seventy.
