Authorized to

to the said Chesapeake and Ohio Canal Company to sell, lease or otherwise dispose of the surplus water of said canal any where within this State, for such uses and purposes as they may deem judicious; provided however, that the full, free and unrestricted navigation of said canal shall not thereby at any time be hindered, lessened or impaired.

SEC. 2. And be it enacted, That this act shall take effect from its passage.

CHAPTER 348.

AN ACT to protect fish in the Great Gunpowder River and its tributaries, within the limits of Baltimore county.

Not be lawful.

Section 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That from and after the passage of this act, it shall not be lawful for any person or persons to take, capture or destroy fish by seine, drag-net, set-net, stir-net, fish-baskets or fish-pots. weirs or any means or contrivances whatever of the nature of a seine, which are known to destroy or capture fish, or to destroy or capture them by shooting or striking them on the ice, one mile above tide-water within the limits of Baltimore county, in this State; provided, that it may be lawful to fish in any way in any of the said tributaries one mile above the mouth of said tributaries.

Offending

SEC. 2. And be it enacted, That any person or persons so offending against the provisions of the preceding section, shall be liable upon conviction thereof, by summary process, before any justice of the peace of this State, in and for Baltimore county, to a penalty of not less than ten nor more than thirty dollars; one-third to the informer, one-third to the constable who may make the arrest, and the balance to the Treasurer of Baltimore county, to be applied to road
