

CHAPTER 388.

AN ACT for the protection of young fish in the waters of Elk River and North East River, and their tributaries, within the limits of Cecil county.

Prohibited

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That no person or persons shall fish at any time in the waters of the Elk River and North East River, and their tributaries, lying and being within the limits of Cecil county, with any hauling seine of any description, the meshes of which are of less measure than what is generally known as "inch and a quarter mesh."

Violating

SEC. 2. *And be it enacted,* That any person or persons violating the provisions of this act, upon conviction thereof before any justice of the peace in Cecil county, shall pay a fine of twenty dollars, and forfeit such seine and the boats and materials used in fishing the same, which shall be sold at public auction for cash, one-half of said fine and the proceeds of said sale shall go to the officer making the arrest, and the other half to the public school fund of said county.

CHAPTER 389.

AN ACT to further amend the charter of the Baltimore and Drum Point Railroad Company, as incorporated and organized under the act of eighteen hundred and sixty-eight, chapter three hundred and sixty-four, entitled "an act to incorporate the Baltimore and Drum Point Railroad Company."

Amended and re-enacted.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That the twelfth section of the act passed at January session, eighteen hundred and sixty-eight
