

Authorized to
sell or lease

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That the Trustees above-named, or their successors, be and they are hereby authorized to sell and convey in fee simple, or lease for ninety-nine years renewable forever, such part of the property belonging to the monthly meeting of the Society of Friends in the City of Baltimore, of which they are the trustees, and not covered by the meeting-house now standing thereon, in such lots, parcels or portions as to said trustees or their successors may seem advisable, and to appropriate the proceeds to the purpose named in the foregoing preamble.

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SEC. 2. *And be it enacted,* That the trustees above-named or their successors, be and they are hereby authorized to sell and convey the rents reserved on said leases, in case any leases should be made, and appropriate the proceeds for the purpose mentioned.

Repealed.

SEC. 3. *And be it enacted,* That all laws inconsistent with or repugnant to the provisions of this act, be and the same are hereby repealed, and this shall take effect from and after its passage.

CHAPTER 391.

AN ACT to refund to Thomas Claggett, Charles Claggett, W. Wheeler, (attorney of William De-Craux,) and Isaac Scaggs, certain sums of money erroneously paid by them into the Treasury of the State.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That the Treasurer, upon the warrant of the Comptroller, is hereby directed to pay to Thomas Claggett the sum of one hundred and eight dollars and thirty-nine cents, and to Charles Claggett, the sum of sixty-eight dollars and fifty-nine cents, the sums paid by them respectively for State tax on
