Directed to pay. SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That the Comptroller of the Treasury upon satisfactory evidence of the above recited facts, draw his warrant upon the Treasurer for the sum of three hundred dollars, which said Treasurer shall and he is hereby directed to pay to the said Jacob Socey, out of any moneys in the Treasury of the State not otherwise appropriated.

In force. SEC. 2. *Be it enacted,* That this act shall take effect from and after its passage.

CHAPTER 411.

AN ACT to repeal section one of article twenty-eight, of the Code of Public General Laws, title "County Commissioners," and to re-enact the same with amendments.

Repealed and re-enacted SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That section one, article twenty-eight, of the Code of Public General Laws, title "County Commissioners," be and the same is hereby repealed and re-enacted so as to read as follows:

Incorporated SEC. 1. The County Commissioners of each county in this State, are declared to be a corporation, and shall have full power to appoint judges of election, road supervisors, collectors of taxes, trustees of the poor, a clerk to their board, and all other officers agents, and servants required for county purposes, not otherwise provided for by law or by the Constitution, and they shall have charge of and control over the property owned by the county, and over county roads and bridges, and may whenever in their opinion the public interest require or will be

Powers
