Authorized to
select or elect.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That Joshua F. Cockey, of Baltimore county, executor of Joshua F. Cockey, deceased, who held in trust the graveyard and premises above referred to, be and he is hereby authorized and empowered to select or elect any one church or religious denomination who will accept the said graveyard and premises, subject to such conditions as he shall prescribe, to convey all the right, title and claim in and to the same of the said Joshua F. Cockey, deceased, as trustee.

SEC. 2. *And be it enacted,* That this act shall take effect from the date of its passage.

CHAPTER 413.

AN ACT to appropriate a sum of money for the purpose of removing the remains of Maryland Soldiers of the late Confederate States' Army, and interring them at Loudoun Park Cemetery, and enclosing and arranging the burial-lot.

Appropriation.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That the sum of five thousand dollars shall be paid out of any money in the Treasury, not otherwise appropriated, to Frederick M. Colston, Treasurer of the Society of the Army and Navy of the Confederate States, in the State of Maryland, "to be expended, in the discretion of the said society, in the removal of the remains of Maryland Soldiers who died in the Confederate States' Army, to be reinterred in the lot known as the Confederate Lot in
