

to article nineteen, of the Public Local Laws, entitled Somerset county, and that section one hundred and thirty-eight, of said article, entitled "Somerset County," sub-title "Retailers," be and the same is hereby repealed.

SUB-SECTION 1. On and after the first day of January, eighteen hundred and seventy-five, no malt, vinous, spirituous or intoxicating liquors shall be sold, or caused or knowingly permitted to be sold, directly or indirectly, or any composition of which such liquors or any of them shall form the chief ingredient, except such as shall be compounded to be used as a medicine, within the limits of Brinkley's District, number three, and Lawson's District, number eight, Fairmount District, number six, Crisfield District, number seven, Dame's Quarter District, number two, and Hungary Neck District, number five, of Somerset county; and any person violating the provisions thereof shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and on conviction shall be fined not less than twenty nor more than fifty dollars, in the discretion of the court, for the first offence, and if convicted a second time, shall be fined not less than fifty nor more than five hundred dollars, and be imprisoned for not less than ten nor more than thirty days, in the discretion of the court; and in every subsequent offence, the fine and imprisonment of the last preceding offence, both as to minimum and maximum shall be doubled; one-half of which fines shall go to the informer, and the other half to the State.

SUB-SECTION 2. On the day of the general election in November, in the year eighteen hundred and seventy-four, the judges of the election districts of Somerset county hereinbefore mentioned, shall receive tickets, written or printed, from the legal voters thereof labeled "For License," or "Against License," and shall deposit said tickets in a separate box provided for that purpose; and the said tickets, so received, shall be counted and returned, and certified according to law, to the Clerk of the Circuit Court of Somerset county; and the same notice shall be given by the sheriff of these elections, as is required in the case of other elections; and said election shall in all respects be subject to and governed by the
