

CHAPTER 433.

AN ACT to authorize the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore City to subscribe to the capital stock of the Baltimore and Drum Point Railroad Company, or to endorse the bonds of the said company.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore city be and they are hereby authorized and empowered to subscribe to the capital stock of the Baltimore and Drum Point Railroad Company, or to endorse the first mortgage bonds of the said company, to an amount not exceeding five hundred thousand dollars, upon such terms and conditions as the said mayor and city council may by ordinance prescribe.

Abell and Company, George W. and J. S. Wilson, Joseph H. Johnson, William H. Ruby, Longnecker Brothers, J. Guest King, W. E. Weber, Keech and Yellott, and Parran and Williams.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That the Comptroller of the Treasury be and he is hereby requested and directed to issue his warrant upon the Treasurer to pay to Charles Cole five dollars; to Welsh, Baker and Company, seven dollars and fifty cents; Thomas J. Turner, three dollars; to W. H. Vanderford, three dollars; to
