CHAPTER 435.

AN ACT to give and declare the sanction of the General Assembly of Maryland to the gift, legacy, devise and bequest of five thousand dollars to the Trustees of Waugh Chapel, in Baltimore county, Maryland, as contained and mentioned in the last will and testament of John Geddis, late of Baltimore county, deceased.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland*, That the sanction of the General Assembly of Maryland be and the same is hereby given and declared to the gift, devise, legacy and bequest of five thousand dollars to the Trustees of Waugh Chapel, in Baltimore county, Maryland, as contained and mentioned in the last will and testament of John Geddis, late of Baltimore county, deceased, for the purposes set forth in said will.
