

whatsoever now existing; but all such suits and actions, and all proceedings whatsoever under the act hereby repealed, shall be prosecuted and proceeded with to final determination and judgment, or final order; and all other proceedings shall be had in such suits, actions or proceedings as if said acts above-mentioned and repealed by this act, had not been repealed; provided, however, that the provisions of this act shall not affect the streets and avenues already laid out and opened by the said street commissioners, and they shall remain as at present constituted.

SEC. 8. *And be it enacted*, That this act shall take effect from the date of its passage.

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CHAPTER 442.

AN ACT to appropriate a sum of money to pay the claims of John Murphy and Company, and Harry Gilmore, Henry W. Jenkins and Sons, John Turnbull and Company, Benton Tolson and Hamilton H. Powers.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland*, That the Comptroller be and he is hereby requested and directed to issue his warrant on the Treasurer, to pay John Murphy and Company for stationery furnished the Attorney General, ninety-eight dollars and ninety-three cents; to Harry Gilmore as per recommendation of the Comptroller for work done in Tobacco Warehouse number five, one hundred and seventy-five dollars; to Henry W. Jenkins and Sons for chairs furnished Senate Chamber, by order of Secretary of Senate, one hundred and twelve dollars; to John Turnbull, Jr., and Company, for materials furnished Senate Chamber, by order of Secretary of Senate, sixty-eight dollars and forty cents; to Benton Tolson for amount of taxes erroneously paid into the Treasury, as per certificate
