for that purpose out of the amount in the Treasury, standing to the credit of the oyster fund.

CHAPTER 452.

AN ACT to enlarge the powers of the Trustees of Huntington Chapel, in Baltimore county, in relation to the holding of property. The said Trustees of Huntington Chapel, having been incorporated for religious purposes, under an act of the General Assembly of the State of Maryland, passed at its December session, eighteen hundred and forty-six, chapter three hundred and twenty-three, entitled "an act to authorize incorporations in certain cases."

WHEREAS, The Trustees of Huntington Chapel, in Baltimore County, were duly incorporated under and by virtue of an act of the General Assembly of the State of Maryland, passed at its December session, eighteen hundred and forty-six, chapter three hundred and twenty-three, entitled "an act to authorize incorporations in certain cases," and

WHEREAS, By said act the property which said corporation, the Trustees of Huntington Chapel, in Baltimore county, is allowed to hold, is limited to the sum of ten thousand dollars, and

Powers

SECTION 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the Trustees of Huntington Chapel, in Baltimore county, shall be able and capable to
