CHAPTER 457.

AN ACT to appropriate a sum of money to pay the claims of Daniel Caulk, Kelly, Piet and Company, Samuel W. Brooks, Kelly, Piet and Company, John Himelheber and Kelly, Piet and Company, Cushing and Medairy, and Samuel Steward.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland*, That the Comptroller be and he is hereby requested and directed to issue his warrant on the Treasury, to pay Daniel Caulk for materials furnished and labor performed in the Senate Chamber, session eighteen hundred and seventy-four, as per order of the Secretary of the Senate, seventy-two dollars and seventy-five cents; to Kelly, Piet and Company, for stationery and other material furnished to the Senate, session eighteen hundred and seventy-four, as per order of the State Librarian, five hundred and thirty-six dollars and seventy-five cents; to Samuel W. Brooks, for services rendered in cleaning Court of Appeals room, clerk's office and consultation rooms, for year eighteen hundred and seventy-three, as per certificate of the Clerk of the Court of Appeals, one hundred dollars; to Kelly, Piet and Company, for stationery and other materials furnished the House of Delegates, session eighteen hundred and seventy-four, as per order of the State Librarian, seven hundred and twenty-four dollars; to John Himelheber, for labor performed for the year eighteen hundred and seventy-three, as keeper of the steam house and Record Office furnaces, sixty dollars; to Kelly, Piet and Company, for stationery and other material furnished for the general use of the General As-
