

igently and faithfully, to the best of their judgment, discharge the duties of their office without favor, partiality or prejudice, and shall file the certificate of the officer before whom the same was taken, among the records of the corporation.

Give bond **SEC. 15.** *And be it enacted,* That the clerk and bailiff shall give a bond, payable to the commissioners, in such penalty, and with such security, as the commissioners may require, conditioned for the faithful performance of the duties of the office of bailiff or clerk.

May pass ordinances **SEC. 16.** *And be it enacted,* That the commissioners may pass such ordinances, not contrary to law, as they may deem beneficial to the town; may open and close streets, straighten widen and improve the same, grade and pave the same, restrain all disorders and disturbances, apprehend and fine all vagabonds; and may impose fines, penalties and forfeitures for the violation of their ordinances.

In force **SEC. 17.** *And be it enacted,* That this act shall take effect from the day of its passage, and the General Assembly reserves to itself the right to alter, amend or repeal this act.

CHAPTER 466.

AN ACT to repeal sections one hundred and thirteen and one hundred and fourteen, of article ten of the Code of Public Local Laws of Dorchester county, sub-title fish, and sections eighty-six and eighty-seven, of article twenty, of the Code of Public Local Laws of Talbot county, and also sections ninety and ninety-one, of article six, of the Code of Public Local Laws of Caroline county, and to re-enact the same with amendments.

Preamble **WHEREAS,** Sundry persons from parts unknown, have heretofore frequented the waters of Dorchester,
