4. In every case, before proceeding to take testimony therein, the said commissioner shall give at least ten days' notice of the time and place appointed for the taking thereof, to all persons interested therein, by advertisement in one or more newspapers published in said county, and where the persons interested are known to him, and reside in said county, also by written or printed notices, to be served upon them by the sheriff of said county; and any person interested shall have the right to appear in person or by attorney before the said commissioner, on the day appointed for taking testimony as aforesaid, to examine or cross-examine witnesses as the case may be; and the said commissioner shall have power to adjourn or continue his proceedings from time to time as the ends of justice may require, and he shall issue process for all witnesses desired by any person or persons interested in any case.

CHAPTER 469.

AN ACT to provide for the purchase of suitable grounds and the erection of suitable buildings thereon, for the State Normal School

Preamble

Whereas, a State Normal School for the more proper and efficient instruction of persons in the art of teaching, has been authorized and established by the laws of this State, and whereas the buildings now rented and occupied by said institution, are entirely unsuited, and inadequate for the purposes thereof, and whereas it is indispensable to the proper efficiency of our public school system that such an institution for the education of teachers should be suitably provided for in our State, therefore—
