Said bill, as amended, was considered, and

Ordered to lie over.

The Senate bill entitled "An Act supplementary to an Act entitled an Act to incorporate the Maryland Institution for the instruction of the blind, passed May 19th, 1853,"

Was read the second time and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

On motion by Mr. Davis,

The Senate proceeded to Executive Session.

Having resumed Legislative business,

On motion by Mr. Blake, The Senate adjourned.
