

sheriff the said list of qualified voters; and the said judges of election shall not receive or deposit in the ballot box the ballot of any person offering to vote until they shall have found his name in the list of qualified voters, and shall be satisfied the person so offering to vote is the person named in said list, and have checked it thereon, except such persons as shall present a certificate of registration from the clerk of some court, as provided in section seventeen of this article, and they shall receive and deposit in the ballot box the ballot of every person offering to vote whose name appears in said lists of qualified voters, and of every person who presents to said judges a certificate of registration as hereinbefore provided.

SEC. 24. The Officers of Registration for the several wards of Baltimore city shall each receive an annual salary of five hundred dollars; and those for the several counties, shall each receive four dollars per day for each day necessarily employed in the discharge of the duties imposed on them by this article, the Clerk of the Superior Court of Baltimore city shall receive one cent for every ten words or figures, and *pro rata* for recording lists of qualified voters, and for making certified copies of said lists; and the clerks of the circuit courts for the counties shall receive the same compensation for making certified copies of said lists, and the said clerks shall receive twenty-five cents for every certificate of registration issued by them under the seal of their respective offices; the sheriffs of the several counties, and of Baltimore city, shall each receive one dollar for every list of qualified voters delivered by them to the judges of election, to be paid to said officers of registration, clerks of courts and Sheriffs for Baltimore city by the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore, and to the said officers for the several counties by the county commissioners thereof respectively; and the necessary expenses incurred by said officer of registration for books, stationery, fuel, office rent, and for publication of notices and lists of voters for the several counties, shall be paid by the county commissioners thereof respectively, and the like necessary expenses incurred for the City of Baltimore, except for books, stationery, fuel and office rent, for which no allowance whatever shall be made, shall be paid by the Mayor and City Council of Bal-
