

CHAPTER 504.

AN ACT to regulate the manufacture and sale of oils for illuminating purposes, repealing an act passed January session, eighteen hundred and seventy-two, chapter one hundred and thirty-five, entitled an act to repeal section two, of chapter two hundred and sixty-six, entitled "an act to regulate the manufacture and sale of oils for illuminating purposes," passed January, eighteen hundred and seventy, and to re-enact the same so as to read as follows: also an act passed January session, eighteen hundred and seventy, chapter two hundred and sixty-six entitled "an act to regulate the manufacture and sale of oils for illuminating purposes," and substituting in lieu of these acts the following:

Repealed. SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That the act passed January session, eighteen hundred and seventy-two, chapter one hundred and thirty-five, entitled "an act to repeal section two of chapter two hundred and sixty-six, entitled 'an act to regulate the manufacture and sale of oils for illuminating purposes,'" passed January session, eighteen hundred and seventy, and to re-enact the same so as to read as follows: and also the act passed January session, eighteen hundred and seventy, chapter two hundred and sixty-six, entitled "an act to regulate the manufacture and sale of oils for illuminating purposes," be and they are hereby repealed, **Substituted.** and the following are substituted in lieu of these acts:

Required to stand fire-test. SEC. 2. *And be it enacted,* That all oils or fluids manufactured from petroleum or its products, used for illuminating purposes in this State, which shall be manufactured or kept for sale therein, shall be required to stand a fire-test of one hundred and ten degrees Fahrenheit before it shall burn, to be ascertained by Tagliabue's coal oil tester, or some other instrument constructed upon the same principle.
