

SEC. 9. *And be it enacted,* That if any of the commissioners so elected shall die, or resign, or remove from said town, or be otherwise disqualified, during the year for which he or they may be elected, the said board of commissioners, or a majority of them, are hereby empowered to fill such vacancies. Shall die or resign.

SEC. 10. *And be it enacted,* That the metes and bounds of the said town of Hillsborough shall extend from the foot of Tuckahoe bridge, along the meanderings of Tuckahoe Creek, until it intersects with the mouth of Lloyd's Branch; thence with Lloyd's Branch until it intersects with the bridge over Lloyd's Branch; thence with the Talbot road until it intersects Queen Anne's road; thence with said road until it intersects Queen Anne's station; thence to Negro Tent, running with Barton's line; thence with the Greensborough road until it intersects the main road leading from Tuckahoe bridge to Denton; thence southeast with Denton road to the corner of Talbot's lot; thence with the boundary line of said lot until it intersects Hacket's lot; thence until it intersects Holt's Church, and thence, by a straight line, until it intersects with Tuckahoe Creek; thence with said creek until it reaches the foot of Tuckahoe bridge aforementioned. All property within said limits shall be subject to such taxes and charges as may be deemed necessary by said commissioners, or a majority of them, to support and maintain the expenses which may be at any time incurred in the improvement of said town; *provided,* said tax shall not exceed the sum of fifteen cents on the one hundred dollars for any one year; and the said commissioners, or a majority of them, shall have full power to appoint an assessor, who shall enter upon his duties as soon as practicable after having taken an oath that he will value the property of said town correctly and impartially, and make a proper and timely return of such valuation to the board of commissioners. SEC. 11. *And be it enacted,* That if any of the owners of property within said town, shall conceive themselves aggrieved by the assessment as aforesaid made by said assessor, they may appeal to the board of commissioners, for a final adjustment of the same. Aggrieved.
