

Is not fair or reasonable

SEC. 7. *And be it enacted,* That whenever the said commissioners shall be satisfied that the estimate or value fixed by such supervisor for work done or materials furnished for the road is not fair or reasonable, that said commissioners shall be authorized to correct the same, and their decision shall be final in the matter.

Examine and supervise.

SEC. 8. *And be it enacted,* That the several supervisors shall carefully examine and supervise all of the public roads in their respective districts as often as the condition of the roads shall require such inspections, and shall give prompt attention to every need of repair which may be called to their attention, and shall report semi-annually to the said commissioners, in July and December, the state of the roads in their respective districts, and the amount of money expended in keeping said roads in repair, and to whom the same was payable; and for the performance of any work or duties not hereinbefore provided for, they shall be authorized to employ suitable persons—such work to be valued, certified and paid for as in the other cases specified; that each supervisor shall be entitled to receive five dollars per day for each day he is actually employed in the discharge of his duties, to be paid by the said commissioners, on the presentation of his account properly sworn to, in July and December, when he shall make his report; *provided, however,* that in no case shall he receive more than the sum of two hundred dollars for each year he may serve.

Employ suitable persons.

May levy special tax

SEC. 9. *And be it enacted,* That in addition to the proper proportion of the general road tax, levied for ordinary expenses of roads and bridges within the county, the county commissioners shall have power, in their discretion, upon the petition of thirty or more land owners within any road district, to levy upon the assessable property within such road district an additional special tax of not more than ten cents in the hundred dollars, to be collected as other county taxes, and to be expended under the direction of the county commissioners in the improvement of the roads within said district.

May be sued

SEC. 10. *And be it enacted,* That any supervisor may be sued before any justice of the peace, in an action
