

shall constitute the third district; and election districts numbered six, ten and sixteen shall constitute the fourth district; and election districts numbered seven, nine and thirteen, shall constitute the fifth district; and election districts numbered eight, eleven, eighteen, and seventeen shall constitute the sixth district.

Shall appoint assessors.

SEC. 3. *And be it enacted,* That the Governor of the State shall appoint three suitable persons in each of the assessment districts of the City of Baltimore, and in each assessment district of the counties of the State, to assess and make valuations hereby directed within their respective districts, said assessors shall be property holders, and each shall have resided in their assessment districts at least one year previous to such appointment, and each assessor shall receive as compensation for his services as assessor, four dollars per day, when employed in the discharge of his duties as such assessor.

Each assessor shall be paid.

SEC. 4. *And be it enacted,* That each assessor shall be paid by the county or City of Baltimore, for the service performed by him under this act.

Boards of control and review

SEC. 5. *And be it enacted,* That the county commissioners of the several counties, and the Appeal Tax Court of Baltimore city, shall be and constitute boards of control and review within their several counties and the City of Baltimore, provided, that there shall be appointed by the Governor, a board of control and review for Baltimore county, which shall consist of seven persons who shall have all the powers delegated to the county commissioners in other counties of this State by this act.

Duty of the Comptroller to prepare.

SEC. 6. *And be it enacted,* That it shall be the duty of the Comptroller, to prepare all necessary blanks and forms to be used by the assessors in their respective assessment districts, and to make such rules and regulations for the assessment of the property in this State, as will assure a correct and uniform assessment; they shall examine into the property of the incorporated companies of this State, for the purpose of ascertaining whether their real and personal property is greater than the capital stock of such incorporated companies, and whenever such is found
