AMENDMENTS PROPOSED.

Section 1, line 14, add the following: "And *provided further*, that no such motion to strike out an order for removal shall be entertained, unless the same shall be made in time to admit of the trial of the cause at the same term of Court at which said order for removal was passed."

Add section 2 as follows: "*And be it further enacted*, That in all civil cases where an order for removal shall have been passed in any cause, the party upon whose motion said order was passed, shall pay or return to the Clerk of the Court in which said cause was pending, at the time of said order for removal, the cost of the record in said case, within sixty days after the passage of such order, and shall cause the said record to be transmitted to the Court, to which the same was
