The House bill entitled an Act to authorize the County Commissioners of Frederick county, to build a new jail, and a work-house for Frederick county; to borrow money on the credit of the county for that purpose; to issue bonds for the payment of the same; to levy and collect taxes for the payment of such bonds, and the interest on the same.

Which was read the first time and referred to Messrs. Steiner, Claggett and Brewer.

The House bill entitled an Act to regulate Fences on adjoining lands of persons in Prince George's county.

The House bill entitled an Act to repeal chapter 287 of the Acts of January Session, 1870, entitled an Act to repeal section 810 of Article 4 of the Code of Public Laws, chapter 367, passed at January Session, 1867, and re-enact the same with an amendment.

Which was read the first time and referred to the Baltimore city Senators.
