Phelps, Crawford and Billingsley, to introduce a bill to revive and extend the Act of January Session, 1872, chapter 420, entitled an Act to revive, re-enact and amend certain sections of the Act of January Session, 1852, chapter 316, entitled an Act to authorize the appointment of a Commissioner to take testimony; to provide for the recording of copies of wills and other papers, of which the originals were lost, by the burning of the Court House in Dorchester county, and to remedy, as far as practicable, the evils likely to ensue from the destruction of the records of said county.

On motion by Williams,

Leave was granted to the Committee on Corporations to report a bill incorporating the Drovers' and Mechanics' Bank of Baltimore.
