Said bill was then returned to the House of Delegates.

The Senate bill entitled an Act to enable the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore to subscribe to the amount of two hundred and fifty thousand dollars to the capital stock of the Washington City and Point Lookout Rail Road,

Was read the second time and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

The Senate bill entitled an Act to authorize and empower the Board of Police Commissioners for the city of Baltimore to purchase or lease ground in said city, and to have erected there on suitable Station Houses, to have the title thereof vested in the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore, and to pay the cost and expenses thereof out the special fund of the said Board of Police Commissioners.
