The Senate bill entitled an Act to further amend the charter of the Baltimore and Drum Point Rail Road Company,

Being on second reading.

Mr. Williams submitted the following amendment:

Section 4, strike out from the word "on" in line 7 to the word "and" in line 7, and insert "another location to be selected by or under the authority of the County Commissioners of the county, or if the said County Commissioner, should fail to make such selection within thirty days after being requested to do so by the company, then on such location as may be selected by the said company."
