Which was adopted.

On motion by Mr. Aydelott, it was

Ordered, That the Hon. John R. Blake, is detained from his seat in the Senate from indisposition.

The Senate bill entitled an Act to pay to Thomas Dent, Justice of the Peace for St. Mary's county, and also James H. Saunders, a Constable of said county, for services rendered to Captain Timmons, in the execution of the Oyster laws of this State,

Was read the second time and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

The House bill entitled an Act for the relief of Washington College, and to appropriate money for the same, and to provide for the education of one scholar from each county of the Eastern Shore.
