The Senate bill entitled an Act to repeal chapter 423 of the Acts of Assembly, passed January Session, 1872, entitled an Act to add an additional section to Article XXX. of the Code of Public General Laws, relating to Crimes and Punishments, under the sub-heading "Embezzling Property and Writings."

The House bill entitled an Act to incorporate the City Bank of Baltimore.

The House bill entitled an Act to refund to Dr. L. C. Cox, sums of money erroneously paid as county tax, or authorize the Commissioners of Talbot county to credit the county tax with the same.

The House bill entitled an Act to make valid the marriage between Joseph Owens and Eva Shepherd.
