## AMENDMENT PROPOSED.

Section 1, at end of section, add: "Provided, that the waters of Talbot, lying between Black Walnut Point and Wade's Point, shall be opened to the citizens of Talbot county, licensed under this Act."

Which was adopted.

Said bill was then read the second time.

The House bill in relation to Justices of the Peace and Constables, in Dorchester county.

The House bill entitled an Act to prohibit trespassing with dog or gun upon private lands, in Dorchester county.

To the Honorable

## The Senate of Maryland:

Gentlemen:—The Report of the Committee on Finance of your Honorable Body, asking to be discharged from the consideration of the Revenue Bill, passed by the House of Delegates, and the action of the Senate in adopting that report, make it necessary that I should communicate to you the exigences of the Treasury, and what action will be necessary in view of the failure of that measure. The object and scope of the bill is to increase the assessable basis, by subjecting to taxation a large portion of the capital and property of the State which has heretofore escaped, and by this means to equalize, as far as possible, the burdens of the people.
