

Said bill was then sent to the House of Delegates.

Mr. Fields moved to reconsider the vote by which the report of the Finance Committee, on the House bill in relation to Revenue and Taxes, was adopted, and to recommit said bill to the Committee on Finance.

Which was adopted.

The Clerk of the House of Delegates appeared and delivered the following:

Senate bill entitled an Act supplementary to the Act of 1865, chapter 151, entitled an Act to incorporate the town of Newtown, in Worcester county, authorizing the Town Commissioners of Newtown, to build a lockup within the limits of said town.

Endorsed, "Passed by yeas and nays."

Also,

The House bill in relation to Turnpike Companies, in Baltimore county.

Which was read the first time and referred to Messrs. Davis, Field and Billingsley.

Also,

The House bill entitled an Act to authorize the Comptroller to settle the claim of Lawrence D. Deitz.

Which was read the first the time and referred to the Committee on Finance.

Also,

The Senate bill entitled an Act to declare the sanction of the General Assembly of Maryland, to the bequest of Rebecca Zimmerman, late of Frederick county, deceased, to the Evangelical Lutheran Church of Frederick.

Endorsed, "Passed by yeas and nays."

Also, delivered the following message:
