And be it further enacted, That until the final adjustment and settlement of the said line of boundary, the temporary line across the Chesapeake Bay, known as the Lovett-Davidson line, shall be faithfully observed by the citizens of the said two States.

The Governor is hereby requested to forward a copy of this Act to the Governor of Maryland, with a request that he present the same to the General Assembly of that State, for their concurrent action in the premises.

This Act shall be in force from its passage.
