

The House bill entitled an Act to repeal the Act of 1870, chapter 59, directing the Attorney-General to cause the State to be made a party in a cause now pending in the Circuit Court of Baltimore city, entitled "The Commissioners of Virginia vs. The Chesapeake and Ohio Canal Company, and others."

Which was read the first time and referred to the Committee on Judicial Proceedings.

Also,

The House bill entitled an Act relating to the measurement of Oysters, at Baltimore, Crisfield, and all packing establishments,

Being on its third reading,

Mr. Brattan submitted the following amendment:

Section 1, line 3, strike out the words "or to any boat engaged in the carrying trade."

Which was adopted.
