be paid as aforesaid, and their award, or the award of the majority of them shall be binding on, and final and conclusive between said parties; and the said Mayor and City Council shall, within one year after such award shall have been made, pay said amounts so awarded to said County Commissioners."

No. 175, an Act to repeal sections 2 and 3 of chapter 302 of the Acts of 1870, to establish voting precincts, in Westminster district, Carroll county.
