The Senate bill entitled an Act to repeal sections 8 and 9 of Article IX. of the Code of Public General Laws, title "Assignment of Choses in Action," and to re-enact the same with amendments.

Mr. Tuck, from the Committee on Judicial Proceedings, reported favorably

The Senate bill entitled an Act to repeal section 119 of an Act passed 1868, chapter 471, entitled an Act to repeal Article XXVI. of the Code of Public General Laws, and to enact a substitute therefor, and to repeal section 22 of Article XVI., sections 99 to 103 of Article LXXV., and sections 33 to 43 of Article LXXXVIII. of the Code of Public General Laws, and to re-enact the same with amendments.
