The House bill entitled an Act to repeal an Act directing the Attorney-General of the State, to cause the State to be made a party in a cause now pending in the Circuit Court of Baltimore city, entitled "The Commonwealth of Virginia versus the Chesapeake and Ohio Canal Company.

The House bill entitled an Act to repeal section 12 of Article XXVIII. of the Code of Public General Laws, entitled "County Commissioners," and to re-enact the same with amendments.

Which was read the second time.

The House bill entitled an Act to authorize the Trustees of the Wiseburg Church, to sell and convey certain real estate.

Which was read the second time.
