Which was adopted.

Said bill, as amended, was then read the second time.

The House bill entitled an Act to pay L. Martin, late Sheriff of Charles county,

Being on third reading.

Section 2. And be it enacted, That the Treasurer shall, upon the warrant of the Comptroller; pay to Peter W. Crain the sum of fifty dollars for money due to him.

Make section 2 read section 3.
