The Clerk of the House of Delegates appeared and returned the following Senate bills:

The Senate bill entitled an Act to repeal Article XXI. of section 7, of an Act entitled an Act to create State Banking Institutions, and to enable the several banks of this State to avail of the provisions thereof, passed at the January Session, 1870, chapter 206, and to impose a tax on the issue of notes put in circulation by State Banks and Banking Institutions.

The Senate bill entitled an Act to designate the Arbitrators, to ascertain and fix the Boundary between the States of Virginia and Maryland.
