Passed Feb 2. A Resolution in favour of Elizabeth J. Waters, Widow of Richard Waters, a Captain during the Revolutionary War.

*Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That the treasurer of the western shore pay to Elizabeth J. Waters, or to her order, during life, in quarter yearly payments, a sum of money equal to the half pay of a captain, in consideration of the services of her husband, captain Richard Waters, during the revolutionary war.

Passed Feb 2. A Resolution authorising the Treasurer of the Western Shore to pay to Henry Harding, for the use of Mary Whelan, the balance of the pension due Joseph Clewly.

*Resolved,* That the treasurer of the western shore be and he is hereby directed, to pay to Henry Harding, or order, for the use of Mary Whelan, (the legal heir of Joseph Clewly,) the sum of eleven dollars and eleven cents, being the balance due the said Joseph Clewly, late a pensioner of the state of Maryland, who was placed on the pension list by a resolution of said state.
