A Resolution relating to the Common Free School Fund. Passed Feb 17

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the treasurer of the western shore be, and he is hereby authorised and directed, to invest the cash now standing to the credit of the common free school fund, and all future receipts which may by law be placed to the credit of said fund, in the reserved shares for which the state may have a right to subscribe, in any of the banks of this state.
