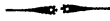

Passed Feb 22 A Resolution in favour of Joseph Wicks the 4th.

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the treasurer of the eastern shore be, and he is hereby authorised and directed, to enter upon the books of the treasurer a credit of twenty-five dollars sixty-one cents, in favour of Joseph Wicks the 4th, (late state's agent) in full for commissions on a certain sum of money recovered on Francis Gillespie's sheriff's bond, and paid into the treasury by the said Joseph Wicks the 4th.
