Appeal from judgment of inspector. Sec. 6. And be it enacted, That in all cases of appeal from the judgment of any inspector of flour, the three persons who shall review the same, shall first take an oath to decide the case to be reviewed, agreeably to the standard to be fixed as aforesaid by the general inspector, and kept in said said public office, and shall then proceed to view and carefully examine the flour in question, and to compare the same with the said standard; and if they or any two of them, upon such comparison, shall reverse the judgment so appealed from, the inspector whose judgment is so reversed, shall put on the cask or casks containing the aforesaid flour such brand as the aforesaid three persons, or any two of them, shall declare to be agreeable to the said standard.

Brand directed.

Prompt attendance enjoined. Sec. 7. And be it enacted, That it shall be the duty of each assistant inspector of flour, promptly to obey any notice he may receive of his presence being required in any place or places in the inspection district of the said city to which he shall belong for the time being; and should such inspector refuse or neglect to obey such notice for a longer time than two hours, after it has been given, he shall forfeit and pay the sum of three dollars.

Duty of general inspector.

Sec. S. And be it enacted, That the general inspector aforesaid, shall diligently superintend the assistant inspectors, at the places where they shall be employed in the discharge of their official duties, and by a frequent comparison of the flour which they shall inspect, with the standard to be fixed as aforesaid, shall ascertain whether they, and each of them regulate the inspection conformably to said standard; and the said general inspector, shall annually, on the thirtieth day of November, report to the Governor and Council the conduct of the different assistant inspectors; both as to their observance of the established standard of inspection, and their diligence in performing their official duties, in their respective districts.

Sec. 9. And be it enacted, That if the general inspector aforesaid, shall upon a careful and impartial examination of the subject, be satisfied, that either of the said assistant inspectors, shall at any time of service of said general inspector, wilfully or from ignorance, put upon any cask of flour, a brand designating a higher or inferior degree of fineness, than according to the true quality of such flour ought to be put thereon, then and in such case, the said general inspector is hereby authorised and required to suspend the said assistant inspector from his office, until the next meeting of the Governor and Council, before whom, and at such meeting the said general inspector shall lay a statement in writing of the grounds of such suspension,
