Sec. 2 And be it enacted, That the mayor and city council of Baltimore, shall be and they are hereby authorised and empowered to borrow such sum or sums of money, and to such amounts, not exceeding one million of dollars, for the use and improvement of the city of Baltimore, and of the property of the corporation, and to aid in the construction of any useful public work authorised by any law of the state, or ordinance of the said mayor and city conneil, and on such terms as they, from time to time, shall deem proper and necessary, any thing in any former law to the contrary notwithstanding.
