## CHAPTER 220.

Passed Mar. 6,1832 An act to make valid the instrument of writing therein mentioned.

Recorded and made valid.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the instrument of wrinting, or deed of mortgage from John Short, and Mary Short, his wife, of Anne Arundel county, in the state of Maryland, to Nathan Warfield of the county and state aforesaid, bearing date the eleventh day of April, eighteen hundred and thirty one, and recorded among the land records of Anne Arundel county, in liber W. S. G. number sixteen, folio ninety-eight, be, and the same is hereby made and declared to be as valid, and effectual in law to all intents and purposes, as if the said instrument of writing, or mortgage, had been acknowledged and executed according to law.

## CHAPTER 221.

Passed Mar. 8,1832 An act to incorporate the Boonsborough Library Society.

Incorporation

Section 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the shareholders of the Boonsborough Library society, their successors and assigns, be any they are hereby constituted a body politic and corporate, by the name and style of the "Boonsborough Library Society," and by that name shall have perpetual successession, may sue and be sued, and have and use a common seal, with power to purchase, receive, and hold, they and their successors, forever, any lands, tenements, rents, goods and chattles of what kind soever, which may be purchased or devised, or given to them for the use of said library, and to lease, rent, or otherwise dispose of the same, in such manner as to them shall seem most conducive to the interest of the said society.

Powers conferred.

Sec. 2. And be it enacted, That the said shareholders, or their successors, or a majority of them, shall have power to appoint directors, a librarian and treasurer, and such other officers as may be necessary, and shall have power, from time to time, to make and establish such by laws, rules and regulations, not contrary to the laws and constitution of this state, or of the United States, as they may judge necessary for the government of said society.

Sec. 3. And be it enacted, That the said society shall have power, in like manner to increase the number of shares if
