CHAPTER 222.

*An act to authorise the commissioners of the tax for Calvert county, to levy a sum of money for the repairing or opening a road in said county.* Passed Mar. 8, 1832

Section 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That the commissioners of the tax for Calvert county, be, and they are hereby authorised, at their discretion, to levy on the assessable property of said county, a sum of money not exceeding one hundred dollars, for the repairing a road leading from Prince Frederick town, to St. Leonard's in said county, at a point near William Hance's dwelling. Levy authorised.

Sec. 2. *And be it enacted,* That the commissioners aforesaid may cause the overseer of said road, to change its direction, in such way as they may conceive best calculated to promote the public convenience, *Provided,* they may deem it necessary so to do. Change of location

CHAPTER 223.

*A further additional supplement to an act, entitled, An act for draining a Marsh and Branch, known by the name of Long Marsh, lying in Queen Anne's and Caroline counties, passed at November Session, seventeen hundred and eighty-nine, chapter fifteen.* Passed Mar. 8, 1832

WHEREAS, it is represented to this Legislature, by a petition of sundry citizens of Queen Anne's and Caroline counties, that the great advantages of draining said branch, already derived, could be increased by extending the same further down, to a place called and known by the name of the Sleeper—Therefore, Preamble.

*Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That Solomon Scott, Geo. G. Simmonds, Isaac Baggs, Peter C. S. Swigget, William Downs, Samuel Crawford, James Merrick, Samuel M. Keene, and Thomas B. Turpin, or any five of them, are hereby authorised and empowered to carry Commissioners named and empowered,
