

CHAP. 234. compensation for their services as the commissioners of Baltimore county may deem reasonable, not exceeding the sum of two dollars per day, for every day they shall be necessarily employed in the discharge of the duties required by this act.

CHAPTER 233.

Passed Mar. 9, 1832 *An act to enable John Cummins, of the State of Delaware, to remove a Negro out of this State, in whom he possesses an unexpired term.*

Permission granted. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That John Cummins, of the State of Delaware, be, and he is hereby authorised and empowered to remove out of this State a negro woman, called Rachel, into the State of Delaware, in whom he possesses an unexpired term; Provided, that the said John Cummins, shall, before he remove the said negro out of this State, execute a bond, with security, to be deposited amongst the records of the county out of which said negro shall be removed; conditioned, that he will not retain the said negro in servitude after her term of service shall have expired.*

CHAPTER 234.

Passed Mar. 9, 1832 *An act for the relief of Francis Jones, of the City of Baltimore.*

Insolvent. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the commissioners of insolvent debtors, for the city and county of Baltimore, be, and they are hereby authorised and empowered to grant to Francis Jones, of the city of Baltimore, the benefit of the several acts of assembly, passed for the relief of insolvent debtors; Provided, the said Francis Jones shall, in all respects, (excepting that of proving residence) comply with the requisitions of the said acts of assembly; and that he satisfy the said commissioners that he did not come into this State with the view of obtaining the benefit of the said insolvent laws.*
