Sec. 2. And be it enacted, That said court may, in their CHAP. 240. discretion, allow such additional compensation to the clerk, for the last year, as they may deem just and proper, over For past year. and above the sum allowed by the act to which this is a supplement.

Sect. 3. And be it enacted, That the provisions of the act Repealing ele to which this is a supplement, in relation to the compensation and salary of the clerks, so far as the same may be inconsistent with this act, be, and the same are hereby repealed:

CHAPTER 239.

An act to regulate the weight of Quercitron, and all other Passed Mar. 7,1832 Ground Bark, Sumach, and all other articles sold by weight in this state.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That Regulation here from and after the passage of this act, that all Quercitron after. and all other Ground Bark, Sumach, and all other articles, sold by weight in this state, that one hundred pounds shall be taken and considered as one hundred weight, and that twenty hundred, be considered and taken for one ton, and so in proportion for any greater or smaller quantity, any law to the contrary notwithstanding.

CHAPTER 240.

An act to close up the Old Road therein mentioned.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That Road closed. all that part of the public road in Anne Arundel county, known as Hood's Old Mill Road, leading from the new Westminster road, through the estate of John Barne's heirs to the public road from near the White House, on the Frederick road, to Sykes' Mill, be, and the same is hereby declared to be closed and shut up.
