Section 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That James W. McCulloh, William H. Freeman, Asahel Hussey, William J. Ward, and James Kelley, be, and they are hereby appointed commissioners, with power to them, or a majority of them, to open and extend Fayette street, in the city of Baltimore, from Cove street westwardly to Gilmor street; as laid down upon the plat heretofore made under the direction of the commissioners appointed by an act of the General Assembly of Maryland, entitled, An act relating to the City of Baltimore, passed at December
