CHAPTER 260.

CHAP. 261

An act to divorce Joseph Harvey, of the city of Baltimore, Passal Mar. 10 from his wife Rebecca C. Harvey.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That Divorce granted. Joseph Harvey, of the city of Baltimore, be henceforth divorced from his wife Rebecca C. Harvey; and the marriage heretofore had and solemnized between them, is declared to be henceforth and forever null and void; and they are hereby declared to be mutually released from all and every duty and obligation, and benefit and advantage growing out and in consequence of the said marriage, and the said Joseph Harvey is hereby declared to be divorced a vinculo matrimonii.

CHAPTER 261.

An act, further supplemental to the act of December Session, Passed Mar. 10, 1832 eighteen hundred and twenty seven, chapter one hundred and eleven, entitled An act to regulate sales by public auction.

Section 1.
