CHAPTER 266.

Passed Mar. 10,1832 A further supplement to the act, entitled, An act to authorise the laying out and opening a road through Frederick, Anne Arundel, and Montgomery counties.

Preamble.

WHEREAS, by virtue of an act of this general assembly, passed December session, eighteen hundred and twentyeight; a public road was laid out and opened through a part of Frederick county, to wit: from the old Liberty road, near Alexander Warfield's mill, to New Windsor, and thence to Union town; but a part of said road unfortunately passing over very boggy ground in consequence of which that part of the said road is generally impassable, for remedy whereof,

Section 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That Moses Shaw, David Fout, and John Roberts, be, and they are hereby appointed commissioners to lay out and open a road twenty-five feet wide, beginning at or near Little PipeCreek, on the north side thereof, at the bed of the said road now leading from New Windsor to Union town aforesaid, and thence in the straightest and best direction the ground shall admit, to the mouth of Winters's lane, and thence in the best direction until it intersects the public road leading from McKinstry's mill to Union town, at or

near the Dunkers grave yard, adjoining said road.

Sec. 2. And be it enacted, That the said commissioners, or a majority of them, shall make and return a plot of said road thus opened to the clerk of Frederick county court, who shall record the same, and the commissioners herein named shall receive the same compensation, and be paid in the same manner as provided for, by the act to which this
