CHAPTER 270.

An additional supplement to the act, entitled An act for the benefit of the University of Maryland.

Passed Mar. 13, 1833

Section 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland*, That Doctors Nathaniel Potter, Richard W. Hall, Maxwell M'Dowell, Samuel Baker, and the personal representative of the late Elisha DeButs, be, and they are hereby authorised to file a bill in the chancery court, or on the equity side of Baltimore county court, against the trustees of the University of Maryland, for the recovery of such sums as may be due to them upon principles of justice and equity, for the disbursements in the purchase of ground, and the erection and repairs of the University and Infirmary buildings, together with the sums expended by them in the purchase of the library, museum, apparatus, furniture and for insurance.

Authority to institute suit granted.

Sec. 2. *And be it enacted*, That the Chancellor, or the county court, as the case may be, shall pass such decree in the premises as to them shall appear just and equitable, and should such decree be in favor of said Professors, the trustees aforesaid, are hereby directed and required to pay the amount thereof to said Professors, or their representatives out of the funds then belonging to the University.

Authority to decide.

Payment enjoined

Sec. 3. *And be it enacted*, That either party may appeal from the decree aforesaid, to the court of appeals, in manner and subject to the limitations prescribed in cases of appeal, from the decrees of the court of chancery, to the court of appeals.

Right of appeal.

CHAPTER 271.

A further additional supplement to the act, entitled, An act for the recovery of small debts.

Passed Mar. 18, 1833

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That from and after the passage of this act, a fieri facias, vinditioni exonas or capias ad satis faciendum may be issued by any justice of the peace in this state, on a short copy of
